

Kaleidoscope Kreator™ Tutorial Series

Printing Multiple Kaleidoscopes on One Page (Paint Shop Pro)

There are often times when you want to print multiple kaleidoscopes on one page. It may be that you have a few different kaleidoscopes that you want to print together to save paper. Or you may want to print multiple sizes of the same kaleidoscope for paper crafting projects. Paint Shop Pro has a very nice **Print Layout** feature that we'll take advantage of!

1. Open the kaleidoscope image(s) that you want to print using **File>Open** or the **File Browser**.
2. Start the **Print Layout** feature with **File>Print Layout...** All open files will appear down the left side of the Layout window (Fig. 1). If you don't see a blank template, you will want to create a new one with **File>New template**.





3. **Optional:** I recommend turning on the **Grid** (Fig.2). To do so, **View>Show grid**.
Also Optional: **View>Snap to grid** turns on snapping to help with "lining up" the kaleidoscopes.
4. Now add the kaleidoscopes that you want to print to the template. Simply click-and-drag the thumbnails on the left side onto the template (Fig. 3). Don't worry about the placement just yet. We'll reposition and resize in a moment.



- There are a couple of ways to resize the kaleidoscope. If you don't need the kaleidoscope to be a specific size, you can click and drag on any of the corner handles of the kaleidoscope (Fig. 4)



Alternatively, if you need the kaleidoscope to be an exact size, you can use the Resize button (Fig. 5a) to bring up the Resize dialog box (Fig. 5b). Select the **Actual / print size** section and set the size that you want the kaleidoscope to be.



The kaleidoscope is automatically repositioned near the center of the template after being resized (Fig. 6).



6. To reposition the kaleidoscope on the template, simply click-and-drag on the kaleidoscope to move it wherever you would like (Fig. 7). If you turned on **Snap to Grid**, you will find that the kaleidoscope snaps to the grid lines. If you don't like this, **View>Snap to grid** to toggle off.



7. To add a second kaleidoscope to the template, repeat steps 4-6. You can add another copy of the same kaleidoscope or add a different kaleidoscope. If you want to add a kaleidoscope that is not in the thumbnails on the left side, simply **File>Open** the kaleidoscope that you want to add. Fig. 8 shows three sizes of two different kaleidoscopes have been added to the template.

8. When you have added all the kaleidoscopes that you want to print, **File>Print** to send the layout to your printer.
9. If you think that you will use this layout again, you have the option of saving the template with **File>Save template...** Give the template a name that has meaning to you. To retrieve the template in the future, simply **File>Open template...** and choose the **User Defined** category. Then click on the template that you saved.
